VCC and Adler University are Partners for Student Success

In September 2024, VCC and the VCC Foundation <u>partnered</u> with Adler University to improve accessibility and learning opportunities for students. The collaboration provides students experiencing undiagnosed learning challenges with access to psychoeducational assessments. These evaluations are often the first step students need to secure learning supports, such as extra time on exams.

The innovative partnership supports learners from both institutions. Student clinicians from Adler Community Health Services (ACHS) conduct the assessments; and VCC's <u>Student Services</u> and <u>Accessibility Services</u> departments customize resources and accommodations for VCC students. The program also reinforces our commitment to prioritizing education access for people with disabilities and learning challenges.

Thanks to generous donors, the VCC Foundation covers the costs of these assessments, which would otherwise be out of reach for many students.

Laptop Lending Library

Expanding the <u>Laptop Lending Program</u> at VCC is a crucial step towards ensuring that all students have access to the technology needed to succeed academically. Thanks to our forward-thinking donors, including the Y.P. Heung Foundation and another generous family foundation, we purchased 40 new laptops that students can borrow for their studies.

This incredible project demonstrates VCC's commitment to equitable learning. To support students requiring specialized tools, VCC lending laptops are modified with software and other adaptive equipment like enhanced microphones.

By equipping students with essential tools, the initiative also bolsters academic success and enhances the overall educational experience at VCC. The Laptop Lending Library also promotes digital literacy, enabling students to develop critical digital literacy skills, and empowering them to navigate and excel in today's digital world.
