FUNDED TRAINING OPPORTUNITY FOR B.C. RESIDENTS



Building Service Worker + Training Program

Are you a recent immigrant (landed within the last 10 years) with permanent resident status or a member of a visible community? Are you experiencing difficulties securing employment? Do you need training/certification and related work experience to find employment? Are you interested in working as a Building Service Worker?

If 'yes', VCC's Building Service Worker + Training Program may be able to help you with your training/work experience needs.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Building Service Worker+ (BSW), a 12-week full-time Skills Training for Employment (STE) program is designed to serve 16 eligible participants through classroom training and hands on work experience and provide them with the skills/certifications needed to secure employment. Upon completion, participants will receive VCC credential and three industry certifications; WHMIS, Pool Operator Level 1 and SuperHost. Program graduates will have the qualifications required to secure employment as janitors, caretakers, custodians, building service workers, housekeepers, maintenance workers or general helpers.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

You may be eligible if you are:

- A Canadian citizen, permanent resident or protected person (under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act, S.C. 2001, C. 27) legally entitled to work in Canada
- ii) Living in British Columbia
- iii) Unemployed or Precariously Employed (working in unstable employment or self-employment with irregular work hours, unreliable remuneration to support self or family

TRAINING SCHEDULE (Schedule includes 3-weeks of Work Experience)

Cohort 1: June 7-August 27, 2021 Cohort 2: September 27-December 17, 2021 Cohort 3: December 06, 2021 – March 11, 2022 Due to COVID 19, classroom training is scheduled to be delivered virtually via Zoom until further notice.
