How to apply and register

- Go to the Registrar's Office (vcc.ca/ro)
- Say: "I want to apply and register for ENGL 1101/1001"
- Complete an application form and pay the **\$35** fee

Bring the following:

- Intensive Academic Reading and Writing report card with a C+ or higher, **or** a 099 Report card with C+ or higher, **or** IELTS score of 6.5 with no score lower than band 6, **or** TOEFL score with min. of 86, **or** VCC English Language Assessment (ELA) with an overall score of 145 and min. of 16 on composition
- Permanent resident card (if applicable)
- Payment for application fee and tuition

If you don't have a language assessment:

When you apply at the Registrar's Office:

- Say: "I want to apply and register for ENGL 1101/1001 and I need an English Language Assessment (ELA)."
- Pay the **\$35** application fee and the **\$60** test fee.
- Keep your test fee receipt

When you take the test, bring the following:

- Test fee receipt
- Government ID
