Use these steps as a guide to ensure that you are prepared.

Be	fore you leave
	Obtain permission to study and enter Canada. Check with your nearest <u>Canadian Visa Office</u> for required documents
	O Apply for your <u>Study Permit</u> .
	O Apply for your <u>Temporary Resident Visa</u> (TRV) or <u>Electronic Travel Authorization</u> (eTA). <u>Select your country</u> to find out if you need an eTA or a visitor visa to enter Canada.
	IMPORTANT: Do not come to Canada without a valid Study Permit and entry visa (if required).
	$\textbf{Scan and email your approval letter to VCC International} \text{ at } \underline{ieadmissions@vcc.ca} \text{ by the deadline in your offer letter.}$
	Plan your travel. Book your flight to Vancouver (<u>YVR</u>) to arrive at least one week before the mandatory orientation or st day of classes – whichever comes first.
	Know travel restrictions. Check your airline baggage and <u>Canadian Customs</u> restrictions before you pack.
	Purchase private medical insurance See 'Important Information for New International Students' for details.
	Arrange housing, at least temporary.

	Have documents ready for Immigration & Customs . Acceptance letter from VCC; your passport, approval letter for study permit
	Get settled . The Newcomers' Guide and videos are available in many languages. Topics include: money & banking, health care, finding a place to live, transportation and more!
	Learn about Vancouver's neighbourhoods and resources . The <u>City of Vancouver</u> 's website offers many tools, such as the neighbourhood <u>navigation map</u> .
	Locate your Consulate and register, if your country recommends.

	Mandatory New International Student Orientation – details provided by email at least 2 weeks before
	 Prepare photocopies (unless have already submitted): passport photo page, study permit, co-op work permit (if issued)
	 Bring important documents: Original educational documents, passport, study permit, co-op work permit (if issued), Letter of Offer, Vancouver address and phone number and local emergency contact information.
	Plan transit route from where you are living to VCC. Use <u>Translink</u> 'Trip Planner'.
